

 - By giving regularly. (I Corinthians 16:2; Leviticus 27:30) –Take part in Dave Ramsey's 9 week Financial Peace University class.**

4. Our Faith Statement- what we believe

1. **The Scriptures**- We believe the Holy Bible, both Old and New Testaments, to be God's Word verbally and fully inspired, inerrant, infallible in the text of the original manuscripts and our final authority for faith and practice. (II Tim. 3:16, II Peter 1:21, John 10:35, Matt. 5:18)

2. **God**- We believe in one Triune God, eternally existing in three Persons- Father, Son, and Holy Spirit co-eternal in being, coidentical in nature (possessing the same attributes and perfections), co-equal in power and glory. We believe that God is the Creator, Ruler, Preserver, and final Judge of the universe. (Gen. 1:1, Deut. 6:4, Matt. 28:19, II Corin. 13:14, Matt. 6:30, Col. 1:17, Heb. 12:23, Rev. 19:16)

a. The Person and Work of God the Father

We believe that God the Father was active in the creation of the universe (I Cor. 8:6, Rev. 4:9-11). He is also the source of all divine revelation (John 16:15, Rev. 1:1, I Corin. 2:9-10, Heb. 1:1-2). Initiating salvation (Eph. 1:4-5), He gave His Son for the atonement of human sins (John 3:16, I John 4:9-10) and raised Him from the dead (Gal. 1:1). He begets all who believe the gospel, making them His children, forgiving their sins, and giving them eternal life (I Peter 1:3, Matt. 6:14). Finally, He is supreme over all things (Luke 10:21, Eph. 4:6) and is judge of all personal creatures (I Peter 1:17, II Peter 2:4) through the Lord Jesus (John 5:22).

b. The Person and Work of JESUS CHRIST

We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God, became man without ceasing to be God, having been conceived in the womb of the Virgin Mary as a result of the ministry of the Holy Spirit, in order that He might reveal the father, triumph over Satan and his work, and redeem sinful man. We believe that He accomplished our redemption through His death upon the cross as a substitutionary sacrifice. We believe that He was raised bodily on the third day and ascended into heaven where He is seated at the right hand of the Father, ministering as our High Priest. (John 1:1-2, 14, Luke 1:35, John 1:18, I John 3:8, I Tim. 1:15, Rom. 3:24-25, I Peter 2:24, 3:18, I Cor. 15:4, Acts 1:9-10, Heb. 7:25, I John 2:1-2)

c. The Person and Work of the HOLY SPIRIT

We believe that the Holy Spirit is a person who convicts the world of sin, righteousness and judgment. We believe that in this age He is the agent of regeneration; the One who baptizes believers into the body of Christ, permanently indwells them and seals them until the day of redemption. We further understand that even in this present day the Holy Spirit cannot be limited or restrained. He can and does continue His work in all areas, including bestowing the gifts of prophesy (in the sense of direction from God, for a specific purpose), tongues, interpretation of tongues, miracles, and healings as He deems necessary. We also recognize, however, that Scripture itself is God's Holy Word, complete in itself, and it cannot be changed, deleted, or added to. Further, already revealed Scripture is the standard to which all of these past, present, and future gifts must be compared and reconciled. (John 16:8-11, Titus 3:5, I Corin. 12:12-14, Rom. 8:9, Eph. 1:13-14, Acts 17:10-11, I Thess. 5:21)

3. **Creation**- We accept literally the creation account given in Genesis, that in six days, by the power of His Word, God brought into being all that is, and that on the seventh day he rested from His labors. We believe that by the power of His Word He keeps His creation; "reserved unto judgment and perdition of ungodly men." (Gen. 1:1-31, Heb. 1:3, 11:3, II Peter 3:5, 7)

4. **Man**- We believe that man was created in the image and likeness of God, in innocence and without sin, but the first man, Adam sinned and in him the race fell, inherited a sinful nature, became totally depraved and alienated from God and is unable to remedy this lost condition. We believe that all men exist forever. This faith in the redemptive work of Jesus Christ will live in the presence of the Lord, and the

unregenerate will exist in everlasting condemnation in the Lake of Fire. (Gen. 1:26-27, Psalm 23:6, Rom. 3:22-23, 5:12-14, Eph. 2:1-3, John 5:14, 29, Rev. 20:11-15)

5. **Sin**- We believe that sin is that which is contrary to the commands and holy character of God. We believe that Satan introduced sin into the world, that all men are born sinners, and that the result of sin is death, both physical and spiritual. (Rom. 3:23, I John 3:4, 5:17, Gen. 3:1-6, Psalm 51:5, Eph. 2:1-3, Rom. 6:23)

6. **Salvation**- We believe that every person needs to be saved; that salvation is the free gift of God given by grace and received by those who place their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as their substitute, who shed His blood for their sins; that once saved, the believer is forever secure in Christ, kept by the power of God. (John 3:16, 18, 36, Eph. 2:8-9, John 1:12, Eph. 1:7, Rom. 10:9-10, John 10:28-29, I Peter 1:4-5, I John 5:13)

7. **Satan**- We believe that Satan is a person, the author of sin, the open and declared enemy of God and His people; and that he shall be punished eternally in the Lake of Fire. (Job 1:6-7, Gen. 3:1-6, Matt. 4:2-11, 25:41, I Peter 5:8, Rev. 12:9, 20:10)

8. **The Universal Church**- We believe that the universal church is the body of Christ, a spiritual organism made up of all of the regenerate (those having faith in the redemptive work of Jesus Christ) of this age. (I Corin. 12:13, Eph. 5:25-27)

9. **The Local Church**- We believe that a local church is to be an organized assembly of believers who have been baptized by immersion, who are in subjection to the Word of God and independent of any external ecclesiastical control. We believe that the local church exists to fulfill the purpose of glorifying God through the evangelism of the lost, edification of the saved, corporate worship, fellowship, the defending of the faith and the observance of the ordinances. We believe in the separation of church and state, the priesthood of all believers and individual soul

liberty. We believe that the two ordinances are baptism by immersion and the Lord's Supper ministered to believers only. (Titus 1:5-9, I Tim. 3:1-13, Acts 2:41, II Tim. 2:15, 3:16-17, I Corin. 6:19, I Thess. 1:5-10, Eph. 4:11-16, Jude 3, Matt. 28:19-20, I Corin. 11:23-28, I Peter 2:9, Rev. 1:6)

10. **Future Events**- We believe in the pre-tribulational, premillennial return of Jesus Christ for His church (the Rapture), an event that is imminent. We believe that the Tribulation is a seven year period of God's wrath which will follow the rapture and which will be concluded at the return of the Lord Jesus Christ to the earth to establish His millennial kingdom. We further believe that at the end of the millennial kingdom, time itself will cease, and all humanity will move from the temporal to their eternal state of being. (I Thess. 4:13-18, Titus 2:13, Dan. 9:24-27, Matt. 24:15-31, Rev. 6:11, Matt. 25:31-46, Rev. 21:22, I Corin. 15:51-53)

11. **Christian Responsibility**- We believe that all believers should live godly lives, separated from the world and triumphant over the flesh. We believe that the regenerate should affiliate with a local church, supporting it by regular attendance, by prayer, and by cheerful giving, as ordained by God in His Word. We believe that the saved are to be witnesses of the Gospel of Jesus to the world, both in word and in lifestyle. (Titus 2:11-12, I John 2:15-17, Rom. 6:11-13, Rom. 8:1-4, Heb. 10:25, Eph. 6:18, I Corin. 16:2, I Thess. 1:5-10)

12. **Sexual Purity**- We believe that the Word of God declares homosexuality and lesbianism to be sinful misuse of His creation, that these practices are a result of the depraved nature of man, and that God specifically condemns them. (Leviticus 18:22, 20-13, Romans 1:26,27) We believe that this sin, as any other, can be forgiven and overcome through the power of the blood of Jesus Christ and that Jesus loves, and directs us to love, those ensnared by it. (Matt. 12:31, I John 1:9, Luke 17:3, II Corin. 2:7-10) We also believe, however, that this sin is a direct attack by Satan upon God's plan for the church and family, and as such we feel the need to address it specifically.

13. **Marriage**- We believe that the Word of god explicitly declares marriage to be a union between a man and a woman. We further believe that the Word of God expressly forbids same sex unions, declaring them to be an abomination in the eyes of God. Therefore we will not allow such unions to take place within our church, or on our church property, and we will not approve, sanction, nor otherwise recognize such unions entered into outside our church. (Genesis 1:27, 2:24, Eph. 5:31, Leviticus 18:22, 20:13, Romans 1:26-27)

The four pillars of lay ministry- these are the pillars that keep the house (p. 8) functioning.

Pillar #1- Every believer is a minister

- Ephesians 2:10- every believer is created for ministry
- II Timothy 1:9- we are saved for ministry
- 1 Peter 4:10- we are gifted for ministry
- Matthew 28:18-20- we are authorized for ministry
- Ephesians 4:11-12- we are to be prepared for ministry
- I Corinthians 12:27- we are needed for ministry
- Colossians 3:23-24- we are accountable for ministry

Pillar #2- Every Ministry is Important

I Corinthians 12:18-22

There are no "little people" in the body of Christ, no one is "insignificant."

If a spoke is missing from the wheel, it affects the whole wheel.

Pillar #3- We are all dependent on each other

Ephesians 4:1-16

Spiritual gifts are not for personal edification. They are for the equipping of the saints (strengthening and maturing) and for the building of the body.

- A Spiritual gift is a specific <u>function</u> to be performed.
- A ministry is the <u>area</u> in which the gift is performed.
- A work is the <u>power</u> by which the gift is performed.

Pillar #4- Ministry is the expression of my SHAPE.

Spiritual gifts- 1 Cor. 12; Rom. 12; Eph. 4

- When do we receive these gifts?
- Can these gifts change?
- These gifts are done in the power of the Holy Spirit!

Heart- A God given passion.

You can have a heart for whatever God gives you a passion for. A heart for teens, elderly, single moms, overseas missions, ect.

Exodus 31:3- these are different from Spiritual gifts, but God will use these also. Athletics, musical abilities, speaking ability, construction, baking, ect.

Personality- are you an introvert or an extrovert; task oriented or people oriented, shy or outgoing

Learn to live in your strengths, how God wired you!

Experiences- Romans 8:28

Education, vacations, job experience, spiritual, ministry, painful things such as sicknesses or divorce.

What experiences have you been through, both good and bad, that will help you to minister.



Spiritual Gifts

- I Corinthians 12:4-11
- Ephesians 4:7-14
- Romans 12:3-8

From the Greek word "charisma" meaning an endowment of God's grace, something given out of grace and not a debt, a spiritual working of God.

Spiritual Gift defined- An ability to an individual believer of God, in order that the believer might serve God effectively, in some particular way.

• Barna Research States- 20% of Christians are using their gifts in ministry related tasks.

This means that 80% of Christians are not using their Godgiven spiritual gifts in the church to help equip, build-up, and strengthen the church. No wonder the church is struggling to accomplish its mission at times.

Appendix A

History of the First Baptist Church

The groundwork for the foundation of the First Baptist Church of Whitney Point dates back to 1842 when religious meetings were held in a vacant store in the village. These meetings led to the organization of the church on June 2, 1842. Soon after the organization of the church the building was purchased and seats and a desk were built. This was used as a meeting place for eleven years.

As the enrollment began to increase from 34 charter members in 1842 to 43 members in 1853, it was decided to build a new building. Land was purchased from Thomas Whitney and a new church was erected on Main St. in 1853 at the cost of \$2,500. It was a modest but comfortable building used until 1886. Under the leadership of Rev. J.M. Crandall, a new conference room, baptistery and dining room were added in 1886. The interior was renovated and redecorated and was then able to seat 250 people with the enrollment being 110.

On April 23, 1897 a great fire swept through the village, destroying the church. Members continued to hold services in halls or other churches not damaged in the fire. On October 4, 1897 the corner stone was laid for a new building. The new church was dedicated on May 5th, 1898.

Around 1915 the church felt the need to build a parsonage. In 1916 a new parsonage was built at the back of the church. On July 22, 1936 the interior of the parsonage was ruined by fire. It was rebuilt and ready for occupancy in August of the same year. In 1935 and 1936 both the church and the parsonage were flooded and in need of repair. In 1942, the church celebrated its 100th Anniversary. A two day centennial program was held and on October 24-25, 1942 under pastor, Rev. Lawrence Grow. The celebration included a song service, a picnic, a church dinner, and a well attended service commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the church. The history of the church was written and read during the service.

During the late 40's there was a need for additional Sunday School rooms, so the ceiling of the auditorium was lowered and rooms constructed above. Under the leadership of Rev. Glenn Gevert, the membership of the church and Sunday school grew to around 100 in 1950.

In the early 1950's the parsonage was again damaged by a minor fire, but was quickly rebuilt and refurbished.

In the late 1950's under the leadership of Rev. Merle G. Whitbeck the church was again busting at the seams. Sunday School enrollment was nearing 200 with 250 in attendance in the morning worship service. Space was too limited for any additions to the building, so a new building seemed logical. It was decided in November 1959 that a separate piece of land should be purchased and a new church built. In September 1960, a site was selected on Rt. 11 north of the village, out of the center of town. Construction began in June 1961, with many members working day and night on the construction. Arrangements were made with the Presbyterian Church to purchase our old building. On March 18, 1962 the first service was held in the new building, with a service dedication being held on April 29, 1962. The theme for the church during that time was taken from Hebrews 13:8 "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, today and forever."

On July 26, 1983 shock waves were felt throughout the congregation as Pastor Gary Hale was killed in a motorcycle accident here on Rt. 11. It was God's grace and peace that saw the church through those trying days until the new pastor was called.

In the fall of 1986, the parsonage behind the church on Main St. was sold and in 1989 a new roomier parsonage was purchased in Dorchester Heights. In 2006 that parsonage was sold and the parsonage on Hemmingway Rd. was purchased.

In June of 1992, First Baptist celebrated its 150th Anniversary. It was less than a year later the church brought on Rick Turner as the first Associate Pastor at the church which led to many years of great work with the youth and teenagers.

In 2001 handicap accessible bathrooms were added near the sanctuary and the nursery was moved to the pastor's study. In 2004 the church constructed the activity center that is next to the church building. It was built debt free and has become a blessing to the ministries of the church, but also a great blessing in helping to meet the needs of many groups in the community. That same year God blessed us also by giving us the 6 acres of land behind the church at no cost. The homes of both Associate Pastors are located on this property.

In January 2003, 4 small group Bible Studies were started. These have produced much spiritual fruit as well as connecting people into the body. Today, these groups remain central to the health and spiritual growth of our church. In 2012 the church sanctuaries and foyer were renovated and modernized. This too was done debt free and God has blessed us with a beautiful place to worship.

To date, our ministries include small groups, Sunday night prayer time, Kids Club, Youth Group, Cups of Cold Water Clothing Center, Walk Ministries, and many more. The church continues to strengthen its focus of missions as we have sent short term missions teams around the world yearly, along with our own members who have left Whitney Point to serve as vocational missionaries.

In keeping with our mission to reach Whitney Point and surrounding areas with the gospel, we will seek to find new ways to reach the lost. The message has never changed, but the methods always will. I would share with you want we are doing now for outreach events, but I do not want you to think that we will continue to do them forever. Our mission is to reach Whitney Point with the gospel and we will work hard to make that happen no matter what shape or form it may take on.

God has truly been faithful to us as a church. We can feel His leading, and know that He is blessing when we follow Him with pure hearts. Times may change, but God remains faithful as we stand on his word.
